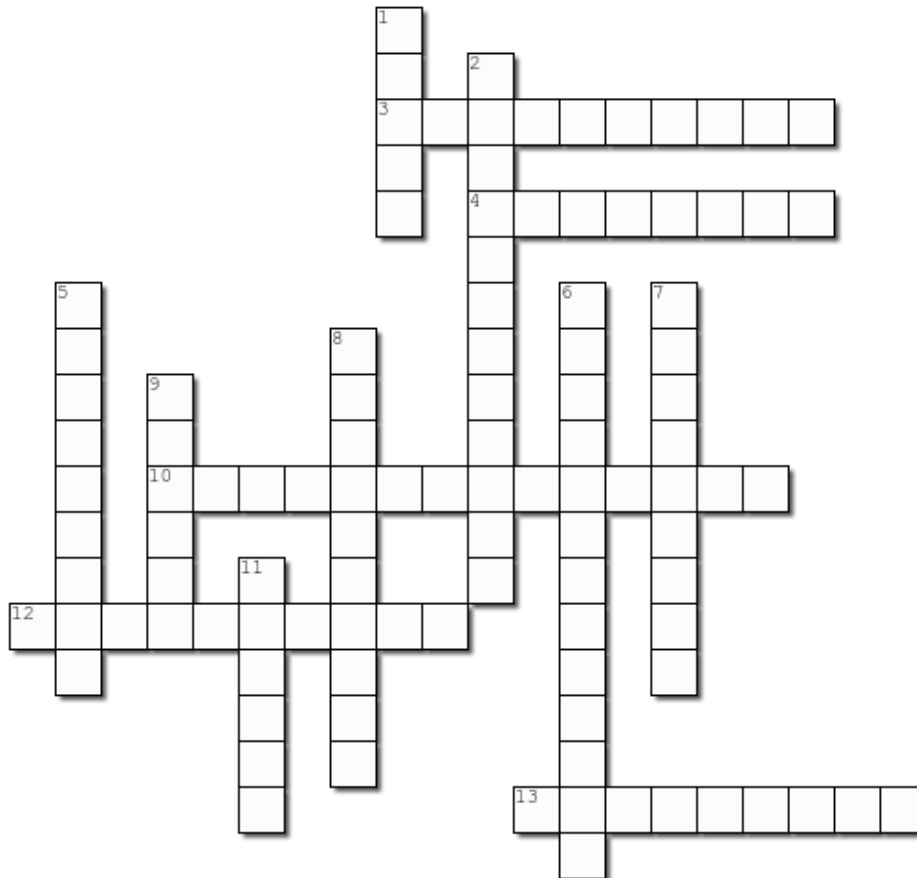




## CROSSWORD PUZZLE
